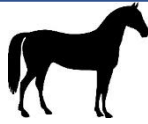

- November – thank your horse with a feast, dress up as a turkey, anything thankful; December – present time! Give your horse a gift, put on some Christmas lights, party it up like it's Christmas day all month long!

[Try Something New! Submit a video of you trying a new event. Normally show dressage? Try barrel racing. A died and true showmanship person? How about hunter under saddle? NO COST for this class, and no awards or points will be given. But you will get judge's comments so you'll know how you did and can practice new skills.](#)

You also acknowledge that an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities. Your payment (or the payment made by your parent or adult guardian) constitutes your acknowledgement and agreement of the rules and liability regulations. Membership Requirement - All competitors must be current members of the Open Horse Show Association (OHSA - visit www.showohsa.com to join). All online shows hosted by OHSA qualify as competitions eligible for points toward year end awards under OHSA.

Entries – You must pay all class fees on the OHSA website at www.showohsa.com under the ONLINE SHOW link. Select your classes, include the names of horse and rider, and pay fees. Take videos for your classes (no still pictures accepted except for the Fun class). Then upload your video to your youtube channel (or other online video hosting service) and email the link to info@showohsa.com. Both entry fees and video submission must be provided between the first and last day of the month of the show. Failure to do so will result in non-entry and no refunds will be given. Entries that are disqualified for any reason, either by the judge or the show will not receive a refund of any entry fees paid.

Adult and Youth Classes Combined – in any class designated as Adult or Youth, if there are 3 or fewer entries it will be combined. For example, if there are 6 Adult and 2 Youth entries we will combine so that the class has 8 total entries and you will be judged together. Points will be awarded for the appropriate age category for overall.

Class/Show Rules

All classes will run under OHSA rules. For classes not covered by OHSA rules the judge will refer to AQHA and/or USEF rules.

Attire – this circuit is DRESS DOWN. Feel free to wear t-shirts or similar, jackets, and/or ball caps and knit caps. Show attire is optional. However, boots and long pants/breeches are required in all classes. Even though this circuit is dress down, appearance does make an impression so neat and clean is important. Helmets required in all over fences classes and in any location that may require helmets.

Number of Horses Shown - Exhibitors may show as many horses as they wish in each class. A horse may be shown by

more than one person in any class. A member may not show the same horse multiple times in the same class except for Dressage or classes that are combined seat (see below).

Dressage - you may show more than one test per class provided the tests are different. For example, you could show in the Dressage class, with an entry for First Level 1 Test 1 and Second Level Test 2.

Combined Seat Classes – you may show a horse more than once in these classes, providing you are showing with different seats or gaits – for example, in Trail you can show as a western rider, and a hunt seat rider. Or in Bareback Pleasure you can show a horse as both a walk/trot horse and a walk/trot canter horse.

Judge's decision is final.

No refunds – for any reason other than member/horse lameness/illness verified with documentation from a licensed practicing doctor/veterinarian.

Videos – all videos must be filmed during the month of the show. Videos found to have been filmed outside of the monthly show timeframe will cause that entry to be disqualified with no refund given.

A single video may be used for more than 1 class so long as it meets the video requirements and is taken during the correct timeframe. For example, if you enter Adult Western Pleasure and Open Western Pleasure you may use the same video if you choose. However, if you enter Western Pleasure and Walk Jog Western Pleasure you cannot use the same video.

Review the requirements for each class in the Show Rules document and ensure your video meets those requirements. (i.e., length of time, views, gaits, class and/or pattern requirements, etc). You may be disqualified for failing to meet video requirements at judge's discretion. Videos should not be set to music and they must not be muted, except for dressage freestyle. Also make sure you have all of the required movements in freestyle or "your pattern" classes. You may be disqualified for not meeting the class requirements.

Videos found to be edited will result in the member and horse being disqualified from every class in the show. Entry fees will be forfeited. Video editing includes stopping and restarting the filming of the video. Videos must be one continuous video.

It is highly recommended that all rail classes be videoed from the middle of the arena and pattern classes should be videoed from one of the long sides of the arena. Dressage should be videoed from C. If you do not have an arena, any relatively flat area (including pasture) will work – just ensure it is free from distractions (jumps or trail obstacles set up in the arena are fine, but remember that you must be able to be

seen in the video) and tall grass may hinder the judge's ability to view you and your horse's work.

Class Awards

All awards are based on horse/rider combination. Entries must elect if they want ribbons for all classes (1st through 6th) or nice rosettes (or other prize like a trophy, banner, photo frame, etc) for circuit classes (1st through 6th). For example, you place In Hand with 3 first; 4 second; and 3 fifth. Earning you 23 points. You can either receive 10 ribbons, or a single nice rosette (or trophy, photo frame, etc).

Email your election to info@showohsa.com. If you do not make an election you will receive OHSA's choice. You cannot make elections for different classes, your election will stand for all classes you enter across the entire circuit.

High Point awards are not affected by the class awards.

High Point Awards

Young Horse Challenge – all in hand classes count toward this special circuit award. Horses can be weanlings, yearlings, or 2 year olds – age as of 1/1; born on or after 1/1/21). Riding classes will not count.

Firefly Mini Horse Award – In memoriam of one of OHSA's first horses enrolled in our organization, Whinny For Me Firefly, we will give a special award for the mini shown in the circuit with the most overall points. To qualify the horse must be either registered with a miniature horse association or measure no more than 34" measured at the base of the last hair of the mane.

Videos must be filmed in the month of the show with the link emailed to info@showohsa.com. Videos should be clear and include you and your horse within the frame as much as possible, as close as possible. Remember that the judge can only judge based on what they can see, so make sure they can see you! Review the Video and Judging Criteria document for all video requirements and judging standards. Failure to follow video requirements may be reflected in your scores and placings.
